Somatoform disorders. Anxiety is directly related to specific physical complaints, but thorough medical evaluation shows no basis for physical complaints. Meets DSM-5 or ICD-10 criteria for a somatoform disorder. Depression. Inability to feel pleasure with an overall sad or irritable mood. Meets DSM-5 or ICD-10 criteria for a depressive disorder.
